

ave you ever considered a fish's natural environment? Water, of course! Fish don't thrive or even survive very long outside of the beautiful environment that God has provided for them. In the kingdom of God, our natural environment is an atmosphere of *praise*. That's where we thrive.

In Revelation 4:1 (ESV), the apostle John saw an open door in heaven and was invited to "come up" and see the

atmosphere of heaven. This invitation was given at a time when John, in his old age, had been rejected for his testimony of Jesus Christ and banished to the isle of Patmos. His surroundings offered him no hope, and his remaining friends were far away. The church was being persecuted everywhere.

At the same time, John was given another view, another reality—the spiritual, the heavenly, the eternal—where praise is being given 24 hours a day! It is centered on the throne room of the universe, and God is sitting on the throne! He reigns! This is the foundation of praise! I Timothy 1:17 (KJV) says, "Now unto the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only wise God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen."

Psalms 103:1 (TPT)

With my whole heart, with my whole life, and with my innermost being, I bow in wonder and love before you, the holy God!

Psalms 145:1,2 (TPT)

My heart explodes with praise to you! Now and forever my heart bows in worship to you, my king and my God! Every day I will lift up my praise to your name with

praises that will last throughout eternity.

In these verses, praise is a life-style, a posture of the heart; not something just reserved for a "worship" song or two on a Sunday morning.

1 Peter 2:9 says that as born-again believers, we are "a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that you should show forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvelous light." The words "show forth" mean "to tell out," to make known by praising or proclaiming; to celebrate. How rich our lives become as we live surrounded by God's love and faithfulness with his praise in our hearts and on our lips! An old catechism

text states, "the chief end (or job) of man is to glorify God and enjoy him forever!"

1 Peter 4:11 (KJV) tells us, "If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God; if any man minister, let him do it as of the ability which God giveth: that God in all things may

be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion forever and ever. Amen."

How would things be different in your life if you began to think of glorifying God as the core purpose of everything? How would you do things differently if you Praise is a life-style, a posture of the heart; not something just reserved for a "worship" song or two on a Sunday morning.

were doing it for the praise of God's glory? Reminds me of an old Jesus Revolution era song, "Kicking the Hogs and Praising the Lord" — "I learned how I can do anything and still be praising the Lord!" THINK – making the bed, clean-

ing the floors, bathing the kids, going to work, driving in traffic. There's only one lifesized compartment of praising the Lord! Party on!

Praise prepares us for problems. It is not the caboose at the end of the train once we have answered prayers. It is the engine at the front of the train that moves things forward. Psalms 50:23 (NIV84), "He who sacrifices thank offerings honors me, and he prepares the way so that I may show him the salvation of God."

We can see this in 2 Chronicles 20. Jehoshaphat was informed that a coalition of enemy armies was ad-

vancing toward the palace in such numbers that there was no possibility of surviving the attack. His immediate response was a prayer of praise—verse 6 (NIV84): "... O Lord, God of our fathers, are you not the God who is in heaven? You rule over all the kingdoms of the nations. Power and might are in your hand and no one can withstand you." Those words alone bring

comfort and peace to the troubled soul and cause faith to rise up. We don't focus on the problem or ourselves. That's not where our help comes from. Psalms 121:2 (ESV) says, "My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth."

2 Chronicles 20 continues where God responded through Jahaziel by telling the king (:15, KJV) "Be not be afraid nor dismayed by reason of this great multitude; for the battle is not yours, but God's." The next morning he sent out singers before the army with a one line chorus (:21)—"Praise [yadah-raised out hands] the Lord, for his mercy endureth forever." Their praise released God to act before they even reached the battlefield. Verse 22 says, "And when the battlefield is the praise that the same to the same and the same than the same and same and the same

"And when they began to sing and to praise, the Lord set ambushments against the children of Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir, which were come against Judah and they were smitten!"

Psalms 34:1-2 (KJV) says, "I will bless the Lord at all times: his praise shall continually be in my mouth. My soul shall make her boast in the Lord: the humble shall hear thereof, and be glad." Our mouth is our address in the spiritual realm. Genuine praise attracts God's promises, purposes, provision and productivity. Look at Psalms 67:5,6 (KJV), "Let the people praise thee, O God; let all the people praise thee. Then

shall the earth yield her increase; and God, even our own God shall bless us."

One last thought. The record of Paul and Silas in Acts 16 tells us that they were in prison, in stocks, yet were singing and

praising God at midnight. Then there was a great earthquake so that the foundations of the prison were shaken. Immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's bands were loosed. One author wrote, "To bind the strong man we exalt the stronger man!" Praise God! ... "I hear the chains falling!"

CHRISTIAN

When we accept Jesus as Lord, we receive his Spirit within us. Having Christ in us makes us Christians and children of God our Father. As we explore the Bible's promises and walk by the Spirit's direction, the character of Christ within begins to transform us from the inside out, revealing Jesus to the world through our lives.



hen my daughter, Mandolin, was young, she played on an intramural soccer team that was participating in "The Show-Me State Games." At the end of their championship game the score was tied. Mandolin was one of three chosen for the "shoot out." She was first, kicked the ball into the goal, and captured their victory! We were screaming, jumping, hands in the air, yelling, and dancing around. We were going crazy, possibly leaping and praising as much as the lame man praised God for his healing in Acts 3.

Is anything wrong with our expressive enthusiasm for sports? No! As long as praise for our heavenly Father is more than that of a worldly event. Hmm...how is it we can physically manifest praise at a sports (or other) event so naturally, and not be nearly so natural or colorful in praise before our Creator? If everything has a spiritual aspect and everything in life either comes from God or not, then praise has to be in our thoughts always, in our hearts, to overflow naturally in the physical, thus pleasing our heavenly Father!

Our minds and thoughts can get infected by "the prince of the power of the air" (Ephesians 2). Words are so powerful! If we over-contemplate worldly words, they become a part of our thoughts, our hearts, and too soon we are manifesting that in our spoken words. Our hearts begin to harden to what God himself actually says. In Jeremiah 17:5 God says, "...Cursed be the man that trusts in man..." Praise God for repentance! I believe praising God holds answers to prayer! Jeremiah 17:14 says. "Heal me, Lord, and I will be healed; save me and I will be saved, for You are the one I praise."

Praise reflects our attitude of heart. Proverbs 4:23 says, "Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life." Proverbs 27:19 says, "as in water face reflects face, so a man's heart reveals the man." So if our hearts reveal us, and praise is paramount to seeing God's word come to pass, then maybe it looks like this—we fill our lives with overflowing praise for Abba Father, and it reflects in our hearts. We are thankful that God will take care of us in all situations. Therefore we worship God with extravagant respect, honor and devotion! We sing, speak and shout our praises to God, pleased and relieved, knowing that our Heavenly Father brings all the good in our lives. We overflow and praise continuously for our Father's love for us!

In 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 Paul writes, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in **all** circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." It is a commandment to give thanks always and to praise God! It is written throughout God's word. Jesus, our example, our Savior, our King, praised God and looked to God for **everything** (and surely still does). Psalm 95:2 says, "Let us come into His presence with thanksgiving [pleased and relieved]; let us make a joyful noise to Him with songs of praise."

In a short (worth the read) blog called "The Praise Cure" (Kenneth Copeland Ministries) a missionary, Rosa Smith, had been diagnosed with small pox with no cure. She asked God in faith what she should do. God answered Rosa with "Praise me. Praise me for my faithfulness to my word." The doctors could not find an answer for her smallpox. "But God did. Praise was the cure." God did not tell Rosa to pray harder, gather more people to pray, or have more faith, He simply told her to praise him for his faithfulness to his word!

Another example, Jahaziel, said by revelation in II Chronicles 20:15 (NLT), "Do not be afraid! Don't be discouraged... for the battle is not yours, but God's." Singers and musicians were placed in front of the army. As they marched to battle the singers began to sing praises, and *as they began to praise*, God caused the enemies to turn on each other. King Jehoshaphat's army reached the battleground and the fight was over! God had already fought their battle, and all of the armies then realized it was God who fought for Judah and feared them. Our Heavenly Father fights our battles while

we do as he pleases and

PRAISE!

So beautifully simple! God bears the burden of our deliverance, as we simply praise, because our Father is always faithful to His Word! In all things, let's give God the glory. We worship with a relieved heart that our heavenly Father, our protector, our provider, our healer, is working for us. Our focus is to continuously praise him for his faithfulness to his word!



here isn't a day that goes by that I don't expect God or Jesus to show up in my life. I anxiously await their guidance. There are days when life is tough and days so smooth. I am like many of you-I keep my eyes, heart and mind focused on the Lord in all that I do.

Deuteronomy 4:29 (KJV) says, "But if from thence thou shalt seek the Lord thy God, thou shalt find him, if thou seek him with all thy heart and with all thy soul." I consider it a monumental honor to be able to repay God's love, guidance, refreshing and encouragement in my life; not that we must ever repay anything, since it has all been bought with a price. Thank you, Jesus!

Life has its ups and downs. Ecclesiastes 3 says there is a time for many things, and my life has had many. I am forev-

er thankful for the relationship that we can so easily access with our heavenly Father and our brother Jesus. As a little girl I praised and worshipped in revival

tents with my grandfather present. As a child, going to the altar in my childlike mind meant I was closer to God. Little did I know that was reality.

There is a private space only you are in when you praise and worship and a peace that truly passes all understanding. I didn't actively express praise from 12 years old until around 2014.

This farm girl from Indiana moved with family to California, and a series of changes began. Praise and worship went off my radar mainly due to the culture shock of going from farming to surfing. In my midtwenties, I moved to Colorado where I became a rock climber. That lasted a few years and then I moved to Maine, bought a Harley motorcycle and traveled on that for a while.

A few years later I became ill, recovered and praise and worship entered my life again through a dear friend there in Maine. I had known this before, but this time was different. I had matured, and praise took on a new reality to me. I experienced such a joyful, peaceful, thankful heart.

My illness almost cost my life, but as I woke up in the hospital one day from a deep sleep, my heart of gratitude took over completely. It was truly a miracle how God saved me that day. I sat on the side of the hospital bed and began to think "praise." Believers came to visit, and we glorified

God together. Psalms 57:7 (KJV), "My heart is fixed, O God, my heart is fixed: I will sing and give praise." I saw the grace in my life, and I was going to honor that free grace. Ephesians 1:6 (KJV), "To the praise and glory of his grace, wherein he hath made us accepted in the beloved."

My friend and I got together one day, playing praise music,

expressing our own individual worship and praise. It brought such joy, such peace, such hunger to honor my Father for all the years he had put up with me. I had visions of being in the ocean when the board hit my head, climbing a mountain on a rainy day on slick rock, driving down a country road somewhere in Arizona on my Harley and the vision of being in the hospital. My heart was so overwhelmed with thankfulness how God had protected

me over the years. My younger childhood was just as dangerous, like swinging from tires into the Ohio River with no adult around. Thank goodness our Father looks on the heart of his people and not how goofy we can be.

> Psalms 73:26 (KJV), "My flesh and my heart faileth: but God is the strength of my heart, and my portion forever." I am truly thankful for all my experiences, whether they were dramatic or not. They taught

me to press on and enjoy every minute of my relationship with God and his Son. There is no better place to be than in the bubble of their presence. Wor-

ship and praise do that for me—a place that is exclusively tender, peaceful, full of life, quieting all outside noise. That's our life in God's kingdom! How glorious is that?

Praise and worship set the sweetest atmosphere on this side of our eternity to come. Experience it for yourself in your own way. Do it alone. Be genuine. Be you. God sees your heart and He will bless you in many ways you never dreamed of.

Psalms 28:7 (KJV), "The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart trusted in him, and I am helped: Therefore, my heart greatly rejoiceth; and with my song will I praise him." I have seen so many blessings in my life through my expressions of worship and praise. It gets us through the most difficult times and gives us a place to be that no one else has ever experienced in quite the same way. It is all about relationship with the kingdom. God bless you all. Have a peaceful, joyful journey on your praise and worship adventures.

he word "unity" in Ephesians 4:3 can also, and perhaps more accurately, be translated as "one-ness." Or, regarding Christians, sharing the likeness of nature with Jesus. In our western culture, we count each thing as one item. A box of 12 blue ink pens that are exactly alike is seen as 12 items in one case. In eastern cultures that same box is one (1). There is one kind of ink inside those pens – all the same. Pivot that thinking to believers in the Lord

Jesus Christ and we can begin seeing each other more biblically. This one-ness has been established by the Lord.

I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you to walk worthy of the calling with which you were

called, with all lowliness and gentleness, with longsuffering, bearing with one another in love, **endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace**. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all. Ephesians 4:1-6 NKIV

When we said 'yes' to Jesus we were changed. The Holy Spirit infused our mortality with the divine nature and made us like HIM (2 Corinthians 5:17, Galatians 3:27-28, Ephesians 4:24). more comfortable to be with people who like what I like, sound like I sound, and look like I look. We must learn to see in Spirit.

Therefore, from now on, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we have known Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know *Him thus* no longer. Therefore, if anyone *is* in Christ, *he is* a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new. 2 Corinthians 5:16-17 NKJV


